Q.6 What is the eligibility criteria for the courses under the Faculty of Science in the University of Delhi?

Ans. The candidates seeking admission in M.Sc. course must have passed B.Sc. (H)/B.Sc. (General)/B.Sc. (Prog.), B.A. (H) examination from the University of Delhi or from any other University whose examination is recognized by the University of Delhi, as equivalent to any of the foresaid examination and also fulfill other conditions of eligibility.

Note: The selection of candidates for admission to the M.Sc. Courses shall be made through Entrance Examination.

Q.7 What is the eligibility criteria for each course under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. The eligibility criteria for admission to each course under the Faculty of Science are as follows:

Q.8 What is the minimum eligibility criterion for admission based on merit in Master's Degree under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. The minimum eligibility requirement for candidates seeking admission in the Master's Degree under the Faculty of Science on the basis of merit are as listed below:

Note: In the event of any shortfall of admissions under direct quota reserved for B.Sc. (Hons.) University of Delhi students, the remaining seats shall be added to the quota for the candidates seeking admission through Entrance examination or vice-versa.

Q.9 What is the relaxation given to a candidate in the minimum eligibility requirements in University of Delhi?

Ans. Candidates belonging to the following categories are allowed a concession in the minimum eligibility requirements as mentioned below:

- The minimum eligibility for admission to post-graduate Courses be the minimum pass marks of the qualifying examination concerned of the University of Delhi in the case of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates who had passed the last qualifying examination from other universities, they should have secured at least the same percentage of pass marks at the qualifying examination as prescribed for the equivalent examination of Delhi University for purposes of admission to the Postgraduate course of this-University.
- Candidates belonging to Other Backward Class (OBC) category shall be allowed concession of 10% marks in the minimum eligibility requirement fixed for General category candidates.

- The PWD (Person with Disabilities) candidates shall be allowed concession of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility requirements.
- Children/Widows of the eligible Armed Forces Personnel (CW Category) killed or disabled during hostilities and those who die on duty; candidates under this category shall be allowed concession of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility requirements. Their provisional candidature is subject to production of Entitlement Card from the competent authority on this behalf.

Note: Admission to candidates under the above mentioned categories is open to Indian Nationals only. Seat meant of PH/CW/Foreign Students will be treated as supernumerary.

Q.11 What is the criteria of attendance required for candidates pursuing their course under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. Attendance at lectures shall not be compulsory. However, attendance in Practical classes shall be compulsory and the students shall be required to put in minimum of 75% of the total number of Practical classes held for each University examination. Students shall also be required to put in 2/3rd attendance of the total number of tutorials, seminars, etc. held in each year as per regulations laid down by the University of Delhi contained in Appendix 11p. 192 of the University calendar-Vol. II.

Q.12 What is the procedure for admission through Entrance examination in courses under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. Candidates shall apply for admission on the prescribed application form available from the Office of the Faculty of Science, Porta Cabin, Near Department of Zoology, University of Delhi, Delhi- 110007. The completed application form together with photostat copies (only) of each of the detailed mark sheet of B.Sc. Examination, Matriculation/Secondary School Certificate bearing the date of birth, Admission Ticket and Bank Draft on account of Exam. Fee for 500/- (250/- for SC/ST CATEGORY) **IN FAVOUR OF REGISTRAR, UNIVERSITY OF DELHI, DELHI PAYABLE AT STATE BANK OF INDIA, SERVICE BRANCH, NEW DELHI (CODE NO. 7687) shall be submitted to the HEAD, DEPARTMENT OF (Quote the Subject offered for M.Sc.) UNIVERSITY OF DELHI (NORTH CAMPUS) DELHI-110007** in person or reach by post on or before **31.5.2013**.

Q.13 What is the procedure for admission based on the basis of marks obtained and not through Entrance examination in the Faculty of Science?

Ans. Candidates seeking admission based on merit on the basis of marks obtained in B.Sc. (Hons.) Exam of University of Delhi only (not through Entrance examination) shall apply for admission on the prescribed application form together with Photostat copies of each detailed mark sheet of B.Sc. examination /Matriculation/Secondary School Certificate bearing Date of birth. **The draft for Rs.200/- shall be payable at the State Bank of India, Service Branch, Delhi (Code No. 7687) and submitted to the Head, Department of (Quoting the subject offered for M.Sc.), University of Delhi, Delhi-110007** in person or by post. A self-addressed envelope of size (25 cms x 17 cms) with postage stamp worth 35/- affixed should also be enclosed with the request. Draft must be purchased only from the branches of State Bank of India. Drafts of other banks will not be accepted. The request for the Bulletin of Information should be addressed to Assistant Registrar (Science) Faculty of Science, University of Delhi (North Campus) Delhi-110007. Last date for Supply of Application forms by Faculty of Science by Post is 23-5-2013.

Note: Incomplete application shall be rejected and the Examination fee sent along with the application form shall be forfeited. Examination fee shall also be forfeited in case the applicant is not found eligible to appear at the Entrance Examination.

Q.14 What is the mode, pattern, medium and duration of the Entrance examination in Faculty of Science?

Ans. The mode of the Entrance examination in Faculty of Science shall be written. The Entrance exam comprises of objective type and short answer questions. The medium of Examination shall be English and the standard of the Examination shall be as per Syllabus of the subject concerned prescribed by the University of Delhi. The duration of the Entrance Examination shall be Three (3) hours.

Q.15 What is the procedure for admission in the courses offered by the Faculty of Science for foreign students?

Ans. Foreign students, seeking admission to various courses under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi, are required to apply directly to the:

- Deputy Dean,
Foreign Students Registry Office,
Room No. 11, First Floor,
Conference Centre,
University of Delhi,
Delhi- 110007.
- Foreign students who are stationed in India and have passed the last examination from Board/University in India may seek admission on the basis of merit along with other students after obtaining a No Objection Certificate from the Dean, Foreign Students, Foreign Students Registry Office.

Note: Foreign nationals having a qualifying degree from foreign Universities are exempted from the Entrance Test requirements.

Q.16 What is the passing percentage and promotion criteria for M.Sc. courses under the semester scheme in Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. The passing percentage and promotion criteria for M.Sc. courses under the semester scheme in Faculty of Science in University of Delhi are as follows:

- The minimum marks required to pass any paper in a semester shall be 40% in Theory and 40% in Practical, wherever applicable. The student must secure 40% in the End semester examination and 40% in total of End Semester Examination as well as internal assessment of the paper for both Theory and Practical separately.
- No student shall be detained in I or III Semester on the basis of his/her performance in the Semester; i.e. the student shall be promoted automatically from I to II and III to IV Semester.
- A student shall be eligible for promotion from first year to second year of the course provided he/she has passed 50% of the papers of I and II Semester taken together. However, he/she shall be required to clear the remaining paper(s) while studying in the second year of the programme.

- Students who do not fulfill the promotion criteria above shall be declared fail in the part concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which they have secured passing marks.
- A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for semester I/III may do so only in the Odd semester examinations to be held in November/December. A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for semester II/IV may do so only in the Even semester examination to be held in April/May, as per the notification of University of Delhi.

Q.17 What is the criteria for reappearance in examination for M.Sc. courses under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. The criteria for reappearance in examination for passed papers in M.Sc. courses are as follows:

- A student may reappear in any theory paper prescribed for a semester, on foregoing in writing his/her previous performance in the paper(s) concerned. This can be done once only in the immediate subsequent semester examination (for example, a student reappearing in a paper prescribed for Semester I examination, may do so along with the immediate next Semester III examination only).
- A candidate who has cleared the papers of Part II (III and IV Semesters) may reappear in any paper of III or IV Semester only once, at the immediate subsequent examination on foregoing in writing his/her previous performance in the paper(s) concerned, within the prescribed span period.

Note: The candidate of this category shall not be eligible to join any higher course of study.

- In the case of reappearance in a paper, the result shall be prepared on the basis of candidate's current performance in the examination.
- In the case of a candidate, who opts to reappear in any paper(s) under the aforesaid provision, on surrendering his/her earlier performance but fails to reappear in the paper(s) concerned, the marks previously secured by the candidate in the paper(s) in which he/she has failed to reappear shall be taken into account while determining his/her result of the examination held currently.
- Reappearance in Practical examination, dissertation, project and field work shall not be allowed.
- A student who reappears in a paper shall carry forward the internal assessment marks, originally awarded.

Q.18 What is the division criteria for a student pursuing M.Sc. courses in Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. A student who passes all the papers prescribed for Semester I and II examinations shall be eligible for the degree. Such a student shall be categorized on the basis of the combined result of Semester I and II examination which are as follows:

Q.19 What is the span period for M.Sc. courses under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. The span period for M.Sc. courses under the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi is four years.

Q.20 Is there any provision for awards and fellowships for meritorious students in the Faculty of Science in University of Delhi?

Ans. There is a provision for Science Meritorious Award for purchase of books to under graduate and post graduate students. The value of award for under graduate (Hons.) and Post graduate students is as mentioned below:

- A. Under graduate students Rs.800/-(approx.)
 B. Post graduate students Rs.1, 200/-(approx.)

Merit indicated in the Entrance Result shall be the order of priority for determining grant of fellowship.
