

Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L)

Q.1 What is the duration for Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L.) degree in the University of Delhi?

Ans. The Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L.) degree is a two year course comprising of four terms.

Q.2 What is the eligibility criteria for Master of Comparative Laws (M.C.L) course in the University of Delhi?

Ans. The eligibility criteria for Master of Comparative Law course (M.C.L) in the University of Delhi is as follows:

- Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) is meant for a foreign national who has obtained a Degree in Bachelor of Law or any other Degree from a country other than India with at least 50% marks which entitles him/her to practice in his/her own country.
- The medium of instruction and examination for this course is English. Therefore, it is essential that the applicant must be proficient in English and must have done his/her earlier education in Law or in the Undergraduate Degree course or Senior Secondary level through English medium. The application for admission to Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) Degree course shall contain a certificate from the appropriate authority to the above effect.

Q.3 What is the procedure for admission in Master of Comparative Laws (M.C.L) course in the University of Delhi?

Ans. The procedure for admission in Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) course in the University of Delhi is as follows:

- The students seeking admission to Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) Degree course shall not be required to appear in any entrance test but all the applications shall be considered on the basis of individual merits. Not more than ten students shall be admitted to this course.
- The candidate seeking admission to Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) course must apply along with the following documents:
 - i. Attested true copy of the University Mark-sheet(s) of LL.B or equivalent Degree examination showing marks and Division obtained ;
 - ii. Attested true copy of University Degree Certificate of LL.B or equivalent degree;
 - iii. Attested true copy of a certificate of proficiency in English e.g. the applicant has passed LL.B or Undergraduate /Postgraduate Degree examination or Senior Secondary through English medium or has passed a test in English language.

Q.4 What is the criteria for Promotion as well as Re-admission in the Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) course in the University of Delhi?

Ans. The criteria for Promotion as well as Re-admission along with other provisions (span period, course of study, attendance) that are applicable in LL.M (two-year) course shall be the same for Master of Comparative Law (M.C.L) course in University of Delhi.
